



*“FESTIVE FALL DECOR”*



These quick and easy festive décor items are sure to warm your home and your heart this fall.

**Supplies:**

- Baby Lock Ellageo or Ellegante Embroidery Machine
- Baby Lock Season's Change Embroidery card BLDP-P22
- Baby Lock Pocket Toppers Embroidery card
- Designer's Gallery CustomWorks™ (optional)
- Designer's Gallery LetterWorks (optional)
- Various colors of embroidery thread
- Cut-away stabilizer
- Bobbin thread
- 1/4 yard of white cotton fabric
- 3/4 yard cotton fall print fabric for outer border and backing
- 1 fat quarter coordinating print for border fabric

1/2 yard cotton fabric for binding  
20" x 18" piece of batting  
All-purpose thread to match fabrics  
Monofilament thread  
Rotary cutter, mat and ruler  
Marking pen or chalk  
Machine embroidery temporary spray adhesive

### Instructions:

#### Wall hanging

1. Place the embroidery card in the machine and select the pumpkin design.



2. Hoop the piece of stabilizer and the white fabric.
3. Embroider the design, using your preference of embroidery thread colors.
4. When the embroidery is complete, remove the design from the hoop and trim any remaining jump stitches. Lightly press.
5. Using the rotary cutter, mat and ruler cut the center embroidery block to 10" x 8".
6. From the coordinating print, cut two strips 2-1/2" x fabric width for the inner border.
7. Using a 1/4" seam allowance, attach a vertical border strip to each side of the center block. Press.
8. Using the rotary cutter, mat and ruler, square off the ends of the border strip.
9. Sew the remaining strip to the top and bottom for the horizontal border strips.
10. Using the rotary cutter, mat and ruler, square off the ends of the border strip.
11. Cut two strips 3-1/2" x fabric width from the coordinating print fabric. These will be the border strips.
12. Using a 1/4" seam allowance, attach a vertical border strip to each side of the previous border.
13. Using the rotary cutter, mat and ruler, square off the ends of the border strip.
14. Sew the remaining strip to the top and bottom for the horizontal border strips.
15. Using the rotary cutter, mat and ruler, square off the ends of the border strip.
- NOTE: Before you cut the batting and backing, measure the wall hanging front piece and adjust the cutting dimensions of the backing fabric if needed.*
16. Cut a 20" x 18" piece of cotton print fabric for the backing.

17. Layer the backing, batting and top piece of the wall hanging. Make sure the right sides of the fabrics are facing out.
18. Using monofilament thread, quilt the border through all layers as desired.
19. Cut 2 ¼" strips from the coordinating print fabric. Fold these strips in half lengthwise and press. These strips will be the binding.
20. After the quilting is complete, use the rotary cutter, mat and ruler to square off all four edges.
21. Cut a strip of fabric 4 ½" x 16" for the rod pocket.
22. Hem both 4 ½" edges. Fold the strip in half lengthwise.
23. Attach the rod pocket to the top edge of the back of the quilt.
24. Attach the binding to the edges on the right side of the wall hanging matching raw edges. Fold the binding over to the back of the wall hanging and whipstitch in place.

### **Pot Holder**

25. In CustomWorks or in "embroidery edit" mode of the machine, select the sunflower design.
26. Then select a script font from either LetterWorks or from the built-in fonts in the machine. Program in "Give" for the first line and "Thanks" for the second line. Position the words above and below the sunflower design.



27. Adjust the size and the layouts of the embroidery elements as you prefer.
28. Using the rotary cutter, mat and ruler, cut the center embroidery block to 5" x 6".
29. From the coordinating print, cut two strips 1 ½" x fabric width for the border.
30. Using a ¼" seam allowance, attach a vertical border strip to each side of the center block. Press.
31. Using the rotary cutter, mat and ruler, square off the ends of the border strip.
32. Sew the remaining strip to the top and bottom for the horizontal border strips.
33. Using the rotary cutter, mat and ruler, square off the ends of the border strip.
34. Cut a piece of cotton print fabric the same size as the finished front piece for the backing.
35. Place the right side of the backing piece to the right side of the front and stitch around the outer edge, leaving a small opening in the bottom edge for turning.
36. Turn it right side out and whipstitch the opening closed.
37. Using monofilament thread, quilt the border through all layers as desired.

Purchase additional yardage and make a bread basket liner and napkins to match.

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
